- Vendor Partner of the Year An honor awarded to an NSTA Vendor Partner for commitment to the
 organization by committee membership, financial support, and providing expertise on important pupil
 transportation issues.
- Innovator Award (given in conjunction with School Transportation News) Recognizes an individual who has made significant, tangible contributions to the industry within the past year as an employee of a school bus contractor company.
- Contractor of the Year Award (awarded in conjunction with School Transportation News) Awarded to an NSTA contactor member company in recognition for service excellence, company culture, and leadership.

He started working in the shop placing buttons and rivets on school bus seats, and then quickly moved up the ladder and became the head service tech at the dealership. When Jersey Bus closed its doors, he transitioned over to HA Dehart and continued his school bus career working on Thomas Built Buses.



PJ began as the shop foreman and soon became the Service Manager., and he has now become a Master Tech certified Thomas Built Buses mechanic and trainer. For the past 15 years, PJ has worked for Irvin Raphael, Inc. as service/facilities manager, and he is the reason the company has been able to grow from 40 buses to over 100, peaking at almost 225 buses with three facilities at one point. His endless knowledge, gained over 25 years of serve, of ever-changing mechanical components and technology in school buses is considerable. 

STA's longstanding commitment to innovation and the environment has placed the company at the forefront of the school transportation industry in the use of biofuel advancements, and now electric vehicle (EV) technology. STA set the bar for school bus alternatives in 2012 when we earned our largest bid with Omaha and Millard Public



Schools in Nebraska. STA purchased more than 400 new, propane-powered vehicles, the largest all-propane school bus fleet in the industry at that time. The following year, STA received the Sustainability All-Star Award for our leadership in running low-emission vehicles. The company continued to expand its "Green Fleet" initiative in markets across the country—including New England and Pennsylvania, introducing the first all-propane fleet in St. Paul (MN), the youngest and largest LPG fleet in Grand Junction (CO), bringing propane buses to Oregon with contracts in Canby, Lake Oswego, and Tigard, adding alternative fuel vehicles to our operational density with Los Angeles Unified School District.

In 2019, STA began making investments in our electric vehicle initiative, and they continue to lead the industry with alternate powertrain and EV technology with their current EV pilot initiative in select rural, suburban, and urban markets. Through funding provided by a variety of grants, incentive projects, and partnerships such as the Vermont Energy Invest Corporation, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP), and the Hybrid and Zero-Emission Truck and Bus Voucher Project (HVIP), STA aims to earn real-world intelligence from our pilot experience with EV battery life, generalized vehicle wear and tear, and other critical KPIs, and the company continues doing its due diligence and making investments now to track EV technology, enabling STA to act and continue to serve as the industry leader. STA works with vehicle and charging station manufacturers, as well as utility companies and other suppliers of the infrastructure needed to support a fleet of electric vehicles in order to address the total cost of fleet ownership. The company continues to pur-

sue these initiatives so that electric vehicles can be widely adopted in the school transportation realm.

Biodiesel and renewable diesel are produced from renewable feedstocks like soybean oil and used cooking oils with different processes. From then through the 1990s, John. remembers the plume of black smoke that would rise above the iconic yellow school buses when the driver started the engine. Cook-Illinois Corporation and its 19 subsidiary companies strongly believe in using biodiesel blends up to B20 because it provides an alternative fuel supply that is dependable and plentiful. Through Cook-IL's use of more than 2 million gallons of B11 and B20 biodiesel annually, the family-owned and operated company is able to provide a valuable market for farmers' products while also reducing emissions and providing a safer environment for the students they transport each day.



The mission of St. Jude Children's Research Hospital is to advance cures, and means of prevention, for pediatric catastrophic diseases through research and treatment. Consistent with the



vision of it's founder Danny Thomas, no child is denied treatment based on race, religion or a family's ability to pay.

St. Jude is dedicated to treating kids with cancer and other lifethreatening diseases. 
